Assessment Outline

In Week 5 you will sit your yearly English exam. This exam contains two parts, both of which will be based on a short film extract by Tim Burton. You will be viewing this text as part of your exam.

Part 1: Multiple Choice questions (10 marks) - 10 mins

- This will assess your knowledge of film genres, camera angles and techniques, and cinematography.

Part 2: Short answer questions (15 marks) - 30 mins

- This will assess your ability to analyse the distinctive features of Tim Burton's style and draw connections between the stimulus and your learning this term.

Non-completion of Task:
