Assessment Outline

The task is to **interview** a person who is AT LEAST 60 YEARS OLD about their experiences in the workforce over the course of their career.

Students will then be asked to **share** what they have learned with accompanying visual aids in a **multimodal presentation that is 5-6 minutes in length**.

The presentation should include:

- a chronological account of the person's work history,
- descriptions of at least two important moments in their career and,
- a personal reflection on how what students have learned from their interviewee will influence their own career planning
- visual aids that represent what students are discussing (this is the multimodal element of the task)

The presentation may be **presented live or submitted by a video recording** that is uploaded to the Google Classroom no later than **3:00 pm on the due date**.

Non-completion of Task:

If you know you are going to be away on the day that the task is due, you must make alternative arrangements with your teacher beforehand. If you are suddenly away on the day that the task is due, you must contact your teacher or Head Teacher on your return to school. Documentation will be required in both cases.

Failure to follow the above procedures may result in a zero award.
