ASSESSMENT OUTLINE:

Research a post-World War Two Australian Migrant's Story, present it to class in a Multi Modal (i.e. *PowerPoint*) Presentation and Speech and complete a Source Analysis.

<u>PART 1</u> – 10%

Speech / Presentation (to class):

- 1. You must include, along with appropriate images and other media;
 - a. Chosen Migrant and their country of origin
 - b. A short biography of person before they came to Australia
 - i.e. Where and when born, details about their life / family.
 - c. What motivated them to leave their country of origin
 - d. Journey to Australia
 - e. Life and experiences in Australia when they arrived
 - f. Evaluate their contributions to Australian society overall

<u>PART 2</u> – 10%

Bibliography (written and handed to teacher):

- 1. Include ALL sources of information you have used in your research.
 - Book or Magazine Name, (Year), Title, Source, ISBN, Page Number
 - Internet Source URL AND Date Accessed
 - TV Program Program Title, Channel shown on, date of airing
- 2. From this list pick **2** sources and complete the following analysis for both.
 - a. What type is it? (Primary/Secondary Source)
 - b. Who made it?
 - c. When and where was it created?
 - d. What does it tell or not tell you?
 - e. Why was it created?
 - f. Was it useful/not useful to your research? Why?
