### Assessment Outline

Students will create a multimedia presentation using Powerpoint or a similar platform, to explore the artmaking and conceptual practices of an artist with whom their own artmaking practice resonates, in response to the theme of Personal Totem.

The following should be included:

- Definition of the WORLD (time and place) of the selected artist. (P2)
- Description of the artmaking and/or conceptual processes of the selected artist, with reference to the relevant Frame. (P1, P3)
- Explanation of the relationship between the student's artmaking practices and those of the selected artist.(P1, P5)
- Analysis of how the students' own artmaking, in process, reflects the Personal Totem theme.(P4, P6)

Submission:

Task submission must be by email or USB drive, **before** 8:55 am in A5. Emails must reach your teacher's email account **before** the 8:55 deadline.

All presentations will occur during class.

### Non-completion of Task:

If you know you are going to be away on the day that the task is due, you must make alternative arrangements with your teacher beforehand. If you are suddenly away on the day that the task is due, you must contact your teacher or Head Teacher on your return to school. Documentation will be required in both classes.
