Assessment Outline

- You will be allocated ONE of the syllabus points from the Unit *Conflict in Europe: 1935-1945* and you are to present a 15-minute lecture on your selected syllabus point.
- Included in your presentation you are to:
 - Address your syllabus point
 - Include background information
 - Explain and Assess** the impact on the war (social, political, economic) and/or civilians
AND
(the following key features are only relevant for certain syllabus points) *the aims and strategies of the Allied and Axis powers, any turning points of the war and reasons for the Allied victory*
 - Include both primary and secondary sources
 - APA style referencing bibliography
- To accompany your presentation, you are to provide:
 - Worksheet that is to be distributed amongst the class including activities
 - PowerPoint or Prezi

Note: Your presentation, worksheets, bibliography and a copy of your slides are to be handed into the library before 9am of the due date OR Submitted via Google Classroom.

Syllabus Dot Points

- Growth of European tensions, including:
 - the collapse of collective security – Abyssinia, the Spanish Civil War
 - Britain, France and the policy of appeasement
 - significance of the Nazi-Soviet Non-Aggression Pact
- German foreign policy, including:
 - aims and strategy of German foreign policy to September 1939
 - impact of Nazi ideology on German foreign policy to September 1939

- Course of the European war including:
 - German advances: the fall of Poland, the Low Countries and France
 - the air war and its effects: The Battle of Britain and the Blitz, the bombing of Germany
 - Operation Barbarossa, the Battle of Stalingrad and the significance of the Russian campaign
 - Battle of El Alamein and the significance of the conflict in North Africa to the European War
- Civilians at war, including:
 - social and economic effects of the war on civilians in Britain, Germany and the Soviet Union
 - the nature and effects of the Holocaust in the Nazi territories
- End of the conflict, including:
 - 'D' Day and the liberation of France
 - Russian counter-offensives 1944
 - final defeat 1944-1945
 - Nuremberg War Crimes trials
