Assessment Outline

Designing a poster on a Japanese Family

Students will be given an opportunity to start the task in class and need to follow the steps below to achieve the course outcomes.

Step 1:

Students **listen** to 2 spoken texts about different Australian families, which contain descriptions of each family member such as name, age, hobby and interest as well as appearance and clothing. The spoken texts will be uploaded on Google Classroom.

Step 2:

Students complete a worksheet based on the texts and submit it to the teacher on Week 5 for feedback and marking.

Step 3:

Students select ONE Australian family and design a poster with a picture of each family member. The poster has to contain all the information and descriptions, which must be **handwritten** in hiragana, katakana and/or kanji characters. The final product is to be submitted in A4 size paper by the due date.

Non-completion of Task:

If you know you are going to be away on the day that the task is due, you must make alternative arrangements with your teacher beforehand. If you are suddenly away on the day that the task is due, you must contact your teacher or Head Teacher on your return to school. Documentation will be required in both classes.

Plagiarism:

Plagiarism, the using of the work of others without acknowledgement will incur serious penalties and may result in zero award. Any cheating will also incur penalties.

Failure to follow the above procedures may result in a zero award.
