Oral Speech (Speaking + Panel Interview) In-Class Test (Listening)

Task Description:

The use of translation software/sites such as Google Translate to construct sentences is explicitly forbidden in the school's Assessment Policy and will result in a mark of zero.

Part 1: Listening Assessment (15%)

Students listen to a text and answer questions in English and Japanese about the text. Students should be familiar with vocabulary and language structures for the topics Personal World (Myself / Family), Daily Routines and Leisure.

Part 2: Oral Presentation (10% speaking 5% listening)

This will be conducted in small groups of 4-5. Each student will show their pre-prepared video, and be asked and answer spontaneous (unseen) questions in Japanese.

Prepared Self Introduction (Video) (Speaking 10%)

- Each student will prepare a video using the Adobe Spark application. The subject of the video is an application for an exchange trip to a Japanese high school in a major city (information in this pack). A model text will be provided.
- You must <u>digitally submit your written script</u> to the teacher, along with your Photostory. You will not be marked on the script but it will be used to give corrections / feedback.

Questions in Response to your Video (Speaking 5%)

• Listeners must ask two follow-up questions related to the presenter's Adobe Spark presentation.

Questions are based off the presentation (sample questions available in this booklet)

- o The teacher will call on students in random order to ask their questions.
- o They must also be mindful not to repeat questions other students have asked
- Students may bring notes on one A4 piece of paper to refer to when asking questions.

Answers in Response to Questions (Listening 5%)

- The presenter must answer these questions in Japanese.
- Answers are expected to demonstrate detail through linked sentences and adjectives, \sim たり、
 - ~たり, etc, where possible.

Outcomes being assessed by this task:

- 1.4 reflects on aspects of past, present and future experiences
- 2.1 applies knowledge of language structures to create original text
- 3.1 conveys the gist of texts and identifies specific information
- 3.2 summarises the main ideas
