Assessment Outline

The Task

You are planning a trip overseas. You have a defined budget of \$8,000 (Australian Dollars) for one person. The timeframe to work with is a 7-night stay in your chosen destination.

The task consists of four sections:

PART A: Researching your destination (10 Marks)

PART B: Organising an itinerary (10 Marks)

PART C: Financial issues (5 Marks)

PART D: Current issues (5 Marks)

Bibliography and presentation (15 marks)

Please use the scaffold provided to ensure that you fulfil the requirements within each section.

You will be assessed on how well you:

- Address the questions with detailed research and explanations.
- Use maps and/or images to enhance your research.
- Present your work. You may choose to write a report, design a pamphlet or create a multimedia presentation using one of the following: Google Slides, Keynote, PowerPoint, Sway, iMovie, Prezi, or Google Tour Builder.
- Keep within the word limit (maximum 3000 words).

Non-completion of task

If you know you are going to be away on the day that the task is due, you must make alternative arrangements with your teacher beforehand. If you are suddenly away on the day that the task is due, you must contact your teacher or Head Teacher on your return to school. Documentation will be required in both classes.

PART A: RESEARCHING YOUR DESTINATION (20 Marks)

1. Choice of destination (10 Marks) Max 300 words

You are able to choose your destination and dates of travel, however it must be an international destination. Conduct some preliminary research of three possible destinations. Justify your choice of destination based on personal, financial, and political factors.

Include a map and mark your chosen destination.

2. Country research

a) CURRENCY / FINANCE (2 Marks) Max 150 words

Identify what currency you will need.

List the current exchange rates compared to the Australian dollar. All expenses for this trip need to be converted to Australian dollars.

b) POLITICAL STABILITY AND TRAVEL WARNINGS (2 Marks) Max 150 words

Identify the overall level of travel advice provided by the Government on www.smarttraveller.gov.au, e.g. be alert, exercise caution, etc.

Check any travel warnings given by the Australian Government for the countries you are traveling to.

c) MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS (2 Marks) Max 150 words

Detail the medical requirements or health precautions to be taken before and during your holiday, e.g. any vaccinations that may be required, or precautions to take when visiting your destination.

d) LANGUAGE / CULTURAL CONSIDERATIONS (4 Marks) Max 200 words

Describe the local customs (religion, culture) that tourists need to be aware of, e.g. language, bowing as a greeting, eating with fingers, etc.

PART B: ORGANISING AN ITINERARY (20 Marks)

1. Itinerary (20 Marks)

The itinerary is to be presented as a daily schedule.

Example of format for itinerary (keep in mind any changes in time zones between destinations)

Your itinerary must include the following:

a) **TRANSPORT**

You will organise the transport between places. This includes airport transfers, tours and travel between cities or site seeing destinations.

b) **ACCOMMODATION**

You may choose from a variety of accommodation types ranging from backpacker hostels to 5-Star hotels. When planning the itinerary, keep in mind that the check-in time is approximately 2:00pm and the check-out time is approximately 10:00am.

c) **ACTIVITIES**

One activity must be organised for each day. This may be sightseeing, a cultural event or adventure activity. There must be at least one group tour and one which is a form of ecotourism.

Collect and save your information for your itinerary as you go. Once you have all your information you can format it into an itinerary. Below is a scaffold for collecting information (not to be submitted):
