PART A:

- Any other interesting information about their role?

You have the option to present it as a:

- Video interview
- Audio interview
- Written transcript of interview

PART B:

Write an article reporting on your chosen person, summarising the information you found out from the interview. Your article needs to be between 500-600 words and needs to analyse:

- a) What are the motivating factors for:
 - i) Getting involved?
 - ii) Staying involved?
- b) What are the major benefits achieved from performing this role?
- c) Why should others get involved in a similar role?

Non-completion of Task:

If you know you are going to be away on the day that the task is due, you must make alternative arrangements with your teacher beforehand. If you are suddenly away on the day that the task is due, you must contact your teacher or Head Teacher on your return to school. Documentation will be required in both classes.
