Students are to complete a multimodal presentation in response to the following question:

To what extent do the narratives 'The Odyssey' and either 'O'Brother Where Art Thou?' or 'The Penelopiad' explore inherently timeless features.

Make close reference to the statement above in your presentation.

Your presentation must focus on **The Odyssey** and either **'O' Brother, Where Art Thou?'** <u>or</u> **'The Penelopiad'.** You <u>CANNOT</u> rely solely on the teacher's interpretation and deconstruction of scene/s in your presentation. Your personal voice and understanding must be clearly demonstrated

The presentation is to be submitted as a video file of no longer than five minutes. The video should feature a spoken delivery of a comparative analytical essay in response to the given question, with visual aids in the form of slides to illustrate the arguments made.

Both the video file and transcript need to be uploaded to the Google Classroom <u>by 3:28 pm on the due date</u>. In the event of technical difficulties with the submission of the task, please contact your teacher immediately to arrange an alternative means of submission.

Non-completion of Task:

This task will be submitted digitally, therefore absence from school on the day of the task is <u>not</u> grounds for misadventure or an extension unless previously arranged with the Head Teacher English and Deputy Principal.
