Assessment Outline:

During the module you have been provided with enrichment opportunities to conduct research into Eckermann's context, participated in whole-class analysis, deconstructed individual poems, poetic devices and the suite of poetry as a whole. This task will require detailed knowledge of Eckermann's textual forms, conventions and features to develop an extended critical response that expresses your ideas clearly and cohesively.

You will be given 45 mins to write a critical response to one of the following questions:

How does Ali Cobby Eckermann use language features to explore identity and culture in her poetry?

OR

To what extent is language closely entwined with individual and collective identity in Ali Cobby Eckermann's suite of poems?

OR

Evaluate the significance of language in Ali Cobby Eckermann's exploration of culture and identity.

***The question used for the examination will be selected at random on the day and will be displayed on the board during your lesson.**

You will be required to discuss *at least* TWO prescribed poems from *Inside My Mother* by Ali Cobby Eckermann.

You may submit *one* draft to your teacher via Google Classroom, minimum of one week prior to the due date as per the draft submission policy.

Non-completion of Task:
