PART A: SHORT ANSWER - UNSEEN TEXTS - IN CLASS

On Monday of Week 9 (29/11/21) you will complete an exam style task during Period 5. This task will mimic the first section of the HSC Examination for Standard English. You will view and respond to unseen texts with short answer style responses.

PART B: ESSAY – BILLY ELLIOT – GOOGLE CLASSROOM SUBMISSION

Compose an essay answering the question below.

"Human experiences are varied and differ for each individual" Evaluate this statement in reference to the prescribed text *Billy Elliot*.

Your response should be 900-1000 words. It must be in size 12 font with 1.5 line spacing. It must be uploaded to the Google classroom by 9am on the due date.

You may submit one draft to your teacher, one week prior to the due date as per the draft submission policy.

Non-completion of Task:

If you know you are going to be away on the day that the task is due, you must make alternative arrangements with your teacher beforehand. If you are suddenly away on the day that the task is due, you must contact your teacher or Head Teacher on your return to school. Documentation will be required in both cases.

Plagiarism:

Plagiarism - the using of the work of others without acknowledgement - will incur serious penalties and may result in a zero award. Any cheating will also incur penalties.
