WELFARE WORDS

- The Cybersmart Presentations by the Australian Communications and Media Authority were extremely informative. Mr Mark Anderson spoke to almost 700 Year 7 to 10 students during Tuesday afternoon, alerting the teenagers to the risks of placing inappropriate pictures and comments on public forums such as Facebook. After school, about 30 teachers from around the Orange area listened to a similar presentation designed to educate us to the use of technology to keep teenagers safe. The final presentation was made to parents and included ways to assist their children keep safe – like having a home computer in a family area; reporting any cyberbullying; keeping records of inappropriate texts; and entering into a cybersafe contract after discussion with every family member. If you missed the presentations or would like to go over some of the content, the web site [ACMAcyber\(safe\)](#) will take you to the relevant information. Remember: stop, block, report!
- *Techno-Bully* is happening today for all Year 7 students. It shows the effects of cyber-bullying on a teenage girl and puts into place strategies all teenagers can use. The play is sometimes comical and will engage the students. The message is quite serious though and should help to reinforce the presentations on Tuesday.
- On Monday, 27th June, people from Camp Quality will visit the school to present a play designed to make teenagers aware of the risks of cancer, what can happen in families that are affected by cancer and show ways that cancer risks can be reduced. The play is called “The Teenage Alchemist” and the target audience is again Yrs 7-10. Camp Quality put this play on free of

charge because we have in our community at least one student who is living with cancer in the home. Camp Quality offer all sorts of support for children both with cancer and living with cancer and are keen to make contact with others in the school who may fall into these categories. Please make contact with me if you feel you would like that extra support and please be assured, all information given is strictly confidential.
