- Are you a grandparent or do you know one? *Interrelate* are conducting a seminar focusing on the needs and changing roles of grandparents on Thursday 4th August from 10a.m.-1.00pm at their centre in McLachlan Street. Please book on 6360 0895.
- Information on the ARCHER study went home with all Year 7 students last week. This study is a longitudinal study which will aim to investigate the role of hormones and the effect on the behaviour, physical and mental wellbeing of rural Australian teenagers. The team from the University of Sydney would like at least 100 students to volunteer to take part in this world-first study. An information night for parents and students will be held on Wednesday, 3rd August, at 7.30pm in the PAC. The university team will be present to answer any questions you may have and will outline the program for testing. There is a 'postbox' outside the cashier's window for consent forms.
- Orange High has also been invited to participate in a Health Behaviours Survey by NSW Health. This is aimed at students in Years 11 and 12 and involves a 45 minute survey. Information was forwarded home early in the week. It is a national survey, involving 25,000 secondary school students and the information provided will assist policy makers and health promotion specialists.
- Consent forms for the Boostrix injection also went home last week for Year 7 and 10 students. This immunization covers Tetanus, Diptheria and Pertussis (whooping cough) and with students' last vaccination usually being just before starting kindergarten, immunity levels are low and require a booster. There is currently a Whooping Cough epidemic in the Western suburbs of Sydney and Orange High has had a notification of the condition already this year. If your child has not brought home a consent form as yet, he/she can
