- Orange High has been invited to participate in a Health Behaviours' Survey by NSW Health. This is aimed at students in Years 11 and 12 and involves a 45 minute survey. Information will be forwarded home after the Trial HSC and conducted in Week 6. It is a national survey, involving 25,000 secondary school students and the information provided will assist policy makers and health promotion specialists
- Any Year 7 or 10 students who missed the Boostrix [Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (whooping cough)] injections last week will 'catch up' when the nurses return in October.
