## WELFARE WORDS

- Orange High has been invited to participate in a Health Behaviours Survey by NSW Health. This is aimed at students in Years 11 & 12 and involves a 45 minute survey. Information was forwarded home this week and the survey will be conducted in Week 6. It is a national survey, involving 25,000 secondary school students and the information provided will assist policy makers and health promotion specialists.
- Athletes' Foot is offering a Schools' Rewards Program. Any family who buys shoes from the store in Summer Street will generate money towards the school regardless of the price of the shoes (\$5 donated back to the school for each purchase). - Interrelate Family Centres are conducting a 3 session program on Being A Dad – Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> August from 5.30pm.-8.00pm. Be a better dad, connect with your children, be able to discipline constructively and deal better with conflict are some of the areas covered. Bookings are essential. There is a cost. - I have been approached by a number of students wanting to give up smoking. The School applauds this action and would recommend that you approach the counsellors at the Community Health Centre in Kite Street. They can register you in the Quit Smoking Program and offer products and plans individualized to assist you in the process. Benefits of quitting are almost immediate: after 12 hours, almost all nicotine has been metabolized; 24 hours later, blood levels of carbon monoxide have dropped dramatically. This means that

there is more haemoglobin in red blood cells available to carry oxygen to the body's cells. After 5 days, most nicotine by-products have been removed and sense of taste and smell improve.....


