BUSH NIPPERS

Amber Collins, Alice Kjoller, Molly Collins, Synetta Manns and Abbey Glennon were part of a group of 33 members of Orange Bush Nippers who attended The Annual BBM Junior Development Camp for surf life saving at Dee Why Surf Life Saving Club from Australia Day through to Sunday 29th January.

Instead of participating in the camp, the girls undertook training and assessment for the Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC). This is the entry level certificate for Cadets to be qualified as Junior Life Savers. The certificate consists of a series of physical and theoretical challenges that include the following:

- A board rescue in surf conditions showing correct procedure and technique in paddling out through the break, (breaking waves) picking up a conscious patient and returning them safely to shore for treatment.
- A tube rescue in surf conditions showing correct procedure and technique in swimming out through the break, safely approaching and securing a conscious patient in a rescue tube then returning them safely to shore for treatment.
- Being able to recognise Surf Life Saving hand signals and respond appropriately.
- A 100m run, 100m swim, 100m run. from the beach out through the break, ocean swim and return to shore in under 5 mins.
- A 200m pool swim in under 5 minutes.
- One and two person CPR on an infant, child and adult.
- First Aid and live patient assessment for a range of injuries.

The girls are now accredited Junior Life Savers with Dee Why Surf Life Saving and attended their first patrol on Sunday afternoon after finishing the course. A series of visits are planned for this year where each of them must notch up a minimum 24 hrs patrol time to fulfill their volunteer obligations.

The girls will attend a presentation dinner later in the year where they will receive their certificates.

As you will appreciate this is a huge achievement for country kids who have trained in flat water and probably only see the beach once a year.
