It has been a busy start to the rugby season this year with three OHS teams playing over two days. Last Wednesday our Under 15s travelled to Mudgee for the NSWCHS Buchan Shield. Unfortunately there was no repeat of last year's Top 8 success with our boys being defeated 41 - 28 by a much more experienced Mudgee side. Our boys had only one regular rugby player and they showed great determination given that for the majority of the boys it was their first game of rugby union.
