IMMUNISATIONS - THE NSW SCHOOL BASED ADOLESCENT VACCINATION PROGRAM 2012.

Each year NSW Health works with schools to offer the vaccines recommended for adolescents by the National Health and Medical Research Council. In 2012, the following vaccines will be

dTpa (Diptheria, Tetanus and Pertussis) - Year 7 and Year 10 students.

A specialised team of nurses will visit Orange High School on Thursday 2nd August (Week 3 Term 3) to implement this program.

Year 10 students have been given a consent form and a Parent Information Kit. If you would like your child to be vaccinated please complete and sign the forms and return to school ASAP. (Year 7 students should have returned the blue form earlier in the term)

Students if you were in a Malynley Shield team (1 signature/team) or an Astley or Mulvey Cup team (3 signatures per sport per tie), remember to approach your coach to have them sign your diary. Western Area representation is worth 4 signatures and a CHS Knockout team e.g. open and junior football, is worth 1 signature per round played plus 1 for every training session attended! It is up to you to claim your signatures.

Luke will be guiding the girls in all aspects of making a short film about someone who gives everything they have got to their sport. They will learn how to plan the make a professional video – from forming interview questions, generating the storyboard, creating a shot list, making an audio recording, lighting, filming, editing and producing. The finished video will then be submitted to the ABC Open Vimeo Group.

Abbey and Samara began the project last week. They asked Jason Belmonte, Orange's very own Ten Pin Bowling World Champion to be their subject. Jason was more than happy to be the person to share his story of what it takes to become the best in the world in Ten Pin Bowling – the passion, effort, guts and determination needed to give 110% to his sport. They spent the afternoon investigating the location for filming and planning the interview.

Jason was soon to be leaving overseas so the girls had to film on Monday night. Over a three hour period the girls interviewed and filmed Jason doing what he does best – bowl. Over the next few

weeks they will learn to edit and produce the final product. The finished film could eventually be selected to feature on ABC Grandstand online.
