Students at Orange High School are sharing in three celebrations this week. **All students in Years 7 through to 10 celebrated Aboriginal Culture through a NAIDOC celebration earlier this afternoon.** During the activity the schools Indigenous Positive Behaviour for Learning Poster was unveiled and presented to the school. A copy of each will be displayed in each classroom to remind all students of the positive culture we are continuing to create at Orange High School. **The school has gratefully received several quality artwork completed by Aboriginal students.** These clever paintings incorporating significant local landmarks and aspects of Indigenous culture will be displayed prominently in the school.

Later this evening, elected Prefects and Student Representative Council (SRC) representatives will be formally inducted into their roles at a special assembly with parents and invited community representatives. **I am excited by the leadership qualities of so many of the 2014 representatives.** Student leadership from the Prefects has already facilitated the successful introduction of the school hats and much discussion about the ongoing development of school culture and pride. I was incredibly impressed with the ideas developed at this weeks SRC meeting with some strong and innovative ideas on how students could lead further strategies around Respect for Others, Property, Environment and Self. **Students leading students is incredibly powerful and something Orange High School will continue to nurture and encourage.**


that families are receiving a low income and have a Health Care Card or Pension Card, and that the student is regularly attending school.

If you are interested in applying, please give me a call or send in a note and I will organise the application for you. I have attached the information flyer for those that are interested. That's all for now,


