PRINCIPAL'S NEWS





I have the privilege of relieving as Principal for two weeks as Mr Lloyd enjoys a well-earned break with his family.




SUPPORT UNIT NEWS

MY WORK EXPERIENCE IN THE ARMY BY ASHLEY SAWYER.

On the $13^{th} - 17^{th}$ of October I was one of 25 students in our area who had the privilege to do work experience at the Royal Military College Duntroon in Canberra. It was an amazing experience. It gave me an insight into the life of a training soldier or officer as a part of the Royal Australian Army.

Throughout the 5 days I undertook many different activities. We did things such as Physical Training which included an over the water obstacle course at The Australian Defence Force Academy (ADFA), the on land obstacle course at RMC and a chance to join in with army recruits in one of their physical training lessons.

One of the highlights was doing the weapon simulation training. Throughout this we got to handle and fire a rifle called the steyr and a machine gun called the Minimi. We also got a weapon demonstration on how to fire and take apart 3 other weapons.

Another highlight was having the chance to listen to a number of officers and soldiers talk about their experiences fighting for our country at numerous places around the world such as East Timor and Afghanistan. Seeing footage and photos was an eye opener to me.

I chose to do this work experience to find out more information about the Australian Defence Force and to see if this was a potential career for me. If you're thinking about joining the Defence force and think that work experience is something that you are considering, look up defence work experience in Google, click onto the second link down and follow the links from there.
