FACULTY NEWS - MATHEMATICS

Hello every one,

Welcome everyone to the 2014 teaching and learning in the mathematics faculty. Starting afresh, we have some new happenings in here. We have a lot to talk about - the New Curriculum, enrichment activities in GATS year seven and year nine classes, staff changes, Chess Club and Mathletes.

Last year, our faculty worked hard to develop new programs based on the National Curriculum. All classes in Year Seven and Year Nine have started these enriched learning programs. The technology and differentiated mathematical teaching are the highlights of the New Curriculum. The aim is to cater for different learning styles of understanding and applying Mathematics. All the students in Year Eight and Year Ten will follow the New Curriculum in 2015.

Mrs Johnston, Head Teacher Mathematics, initiated and re-introduced takehome assessments for all Year groups this year. These assignments replace the conventional topic tests and account for 20% of the total yearly grades. At Orange High, we believe assessment is about providing every opportunity for all students to experience success in Mathematics. It gives students a chance to showcase their knowledge and skills without the pressure of a class test or examination.

Year 2014 is very happening with the introduction of High Achievers' Classes in Year Seven and Nine. Mrs Sood (Year Seven) and Mrs Penny (Year Nine) enjoyed their Professional Training last year to cater to the learning needs of the Gifted and Talented students. The focus for these groups is developing deep learning and participating in open-ended investigations. Mr Lloyd has already visited the Year Seven Group and was impressed with the challenging content presented to the students and their enthusiasm displayed in these tasks.

As with the previous years, Orange High School will be participating in the Mathematics Competitions in 2014. The first round of the NSW Junior Chess League has been announced. To select the best team, the Chess Club is on every Wednesday with Mrs Sood in room 109. All students are welcome to join and extend their mathematical thinking in this clever sport. Going by the chess rankings, we should be able to verse a neighbouring school in week eight.

Finally, Mathletes are back in action! Every Thursday, eager and enthusiastic students are invited to room 109 for a challenging and fun filled experience. Be there or be square!



MOBILE DENTAL CARE CLINIC

We are taking the opportunity to promote the Medicare 'Grow up Smiling' Program, a Mobile Dental Care Unit. This scheme has been introduced by the Australian Government and replaces the existing Medical Teen Dental Plan. A copy of their newsletter was in the OHS newsletter last week.

The Mobile Dental Care Clinic will be in the school at the end of Term 1 (weeks, 9, 10 and 11 to see student in Years 7-11) and possibly a few days into Term 2 (to see Year 12 students as they are doing exams at the end of Term1).

It is a big undertaking and may cause some disruption to classes as students are booked into 10-15 minute appointments to go into the clinic for a teeth assessment and clean.

If you are interested in your child having the teeth assessment and clean at the Mobile Dental Care Clinic, during school, PLEASE FILL IN THE FORM SENT HOME YESTERDAY AND RETURN IT ASAP (STUDENTS NEED TO HAND IT IN TO THEIR ROLL CALL TEACHER). The Dental team will contact you and discuss your eligibility and the associated process.

DISABILITY PROVISIONS FOR SENIOR STUDENTS Practical Support for Higher School Certificate Examinations Information for Students and Parents

The Board of Studies has a program to help students with practical support in their Higher School Certificate examinations. This practical support, known as provisions, assists students to read examination questions and to write their answers. Provisions include rest breaks and extra time.

The use of any provision is not written on the student's results. Students may need provisions for:

- a permanent condition, such as diabetes or reading difficulty
- a temporary condition, such as a broken arm, or
- an intermittent condition, such as back pain when sitting for long periods.

It is not embarrassing to apply for or use provisions. More than 5000 HSC students apply for provisions each year. Provisions help students to show the markers what they know and can do.

To apply for provisions, the school submits an online application to the Board of Studies. This application tells us which provisions the student is requesting and includes recent evidence.

Evidence may include medical reports, reading results, spelling results, writing samples and teacher comments.

Much of the evidence can be collected by the school, but the parents' role is welcome and needed. Parents help by talking with the school, describing the student's needs, and providing the school with medical or other reports.

Applications for provisions should be submitted by the school to the Board of Studies by the end of Term 1. Late applications are accepted for an emergency, such as a broken arm, until the time of the examinations.

Once the Board of Studies has made a decision about which provisions are approved or declined, a decision letter is provided to the school. The school will provide the student with a copy of the letter.

If you or the school are not satisfied with the Board's decision, it is possible for the school to lodge an appeal. Appeals must state why the Board's decision is unsuitable and must include new evidence to support the appeal.

If you think that you or your child may require support in completing the Higher School Certificate examinations, please discuss the matter with the Year Adviser.
