PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

It has been our pleasure to welcome students and teachers from Ushiku Eishin School in Japan this week. Students from Years 8 through to 11 at Orange High School are billeting a total of 20 students. Throughout the week, the students from Japan have undertaken a range of activities; including, a visit to Cadia Mine, a tour of Orange and a formal Mayoral welcome yesterday at the Council Chambers, where Mayor John Davis shared the Mayoral chains. The visit is a wonderful opportunity for all students to develop a deeper first-hand understanding of different cultures and values. Hosting a billet ourselves, our family has already learnt a lot about Japan and enjoyed lots of laughs as we have worked to overcome the language barrier.

Interim Reports were distributed last Monday to all students in Year 7 and 11. The interim reports are a summary of how students have settled into High School (Year 7) and senior school (Year 11). It was particularly impressive to see the large number of students who achieved all 'Excellent' ticks on their reports indicating an exceptional start to their studies in 2014. Of course all students will receive a full report on their learning and achievements at the end of next term. Equally impressive this week was the release of Positive Behaviour for Learning data which confirmed a dramatic 200% drop in negative entries on our database compared to the same time and period last year in 2013. This means that for weeks 1 to 5 this year there was only 1 referral compared to 3, for the same period last year. This confirms anecdotal evidence that the school feels far more settled and is testament to high levels of collaboration between teachers and students.

Improving communication is one of our ongoing projects. Earlier this week for the first time we began trialing an email early in the week outlining activities for the coming week. We are playing with the format and timing of it being sent and would value your feedback as to its relevance, timing and/or set-out. The project of redeveloping the northern side of the GYM was going to be a costly and challenging task for many students. I would like to thank the P&C for their support in financing a section of the project.




Along this journey many students have learnt a high range of skills such as excavation, demolition, concreting, blocklaying, plumbing and finally landscaping.


