### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

**Congratulations to Sean Faucett following the award of a 2014 NSW Mining Scholarship through Cadia Valley Operations.** It is terrific to see students such as Sean engage with and forge potential careers in vocational areas. In addition we are pleased to have a number of students undertaking a variety of school based traineeships where students complete educational qualifications at the same time as pursuing vocational pathways. In many circumstances a combined pattern of study leads to full-time apprenticeships and traineeships beyond school.

**Last Wednesday I enjoyed the opportunity to present certificates to the latest group of Year 5 and 6 students completing the e2 Transition Science Experience.** It was terrific to talk with students who were so excited about the prospect of beginning high school. The five week science program allows students a small insight into high school routines and expectations. We look forward to welcoming another group of students from other partner primary schools next week.



**This week students in Years 8 and 10 will complete their Mid-Course Exams in the Performing Arts Centre while students in Year 7 and 9 will complete theirs next week.** The exams are being conducted centrally to ensure the development of skills leading to the further development of our high achieving academic culture. The results of the exams will be incorporated into each child's individual report to be distributed before the conclusion of the term.

Part of the reason why the Mid-Course Exams are being conducted this week is to facilitate the sporting and cultural exchange with Gosford High School next week. It is hoped that in future years the annual timing of the Gosford will be moved back to allow a greater focus and importance on academic achievement in the Mid-Course Exams in coming years. **We wish the 200 students or more who will travel to Gosford next week the best of luck in the sporting arena and an enjoyable cultural exchange. Gosford is a terrific lead up to the Astley Cup competition at the end of term and a great opportunity for our teams to practise their skills and teamwork.**

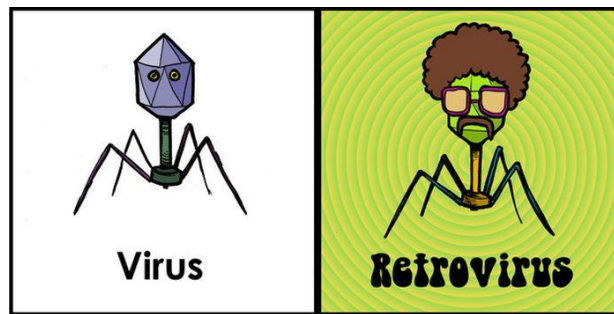
