Congratulations to Connor Swords in Year 9 on his selection as one of the top performers in the Australian Mathematics Competition. As a result Connor has been offered an opportunity to attend digIT. digIT is an initiative of, and funded by, the Australian Government Department of Education and Training and is delivered by the Australian Maths Trust. DigIT is a program designed to introduce students with potential to algorithmic thinking, coding and other aspects of ICT, and to encourage the continuance of ICT studies in senior secondary school and at tertiary level. It will combine two residential camps with a mentoring

program over a six-month period. The camps will be held in Sydney in January and July 2017. I understand there has only been 60 students offered the opportunity. Congratulations Connor!

Our Agriculture Team won the Senior Section of the NSW Cows Create Careers initiative. This was as a result of the team designing contemporary farm plans in the form of models and movies and writing scientific reports incorporating and comparing the growth rates of cattle including comparisons with the achieved rates of animals on the school farm. Miranda Eyb and Jordan Baxter won Third place in the state for their work with a score of 90/100. Miranda and Jordan both have an outstanding agricultural skillset. It is terrific to see the continued growth of this area of our school and I would like to commend the students and the teachers at the highest level.



This week our school has hosted the first of 2 rounds of Year 7 2017 student Transitions as we hosted students from Calare and Bletchington Primary Schools. Judging by their faces and attitude the students enjoyed the day and developed confidence in our high school setting. We look forward to hosting students from Orange Primary and partner small schools next week on Wednesday and Thursday for the final half of the 2017 Transition.

Last Monday our school hosted a visit from Minister for Education, The Hon. Adrian Piccoli MP. During his time in our school the Minister hosted a discussion with local principals, P&C and AECG members. Invited guests asked a wide range of questions and received direct answers from the Minister. Many local mental health services were in attendance including Headspace, Inter-Relate, Mission Australia and the Gardening Club.

The services in attendance provided students, and members of the community, information about dealing with mental health concerns and how these groups support both carers and those experiencing mental health issues. Many of the services provided 'hands on' activities to show the benefits of mindfulness. Orange High students immersed themselves in all activities, giving impromptu



performances and embracing the positive culture of the day. A number of stall holders provided valuable free resources and students were delighted with the products they received.
