

Online Safety

I had the opportunity to attend a workshop about keeping children safe online. It was a very valuable learning experience for me and I'd like to share some key points with you so together we can protect and educate young people in our care.

The organisation is called the eSafety Commissioner (Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner).

'The Office is committed to helping young people have safe, positive experiences online and encouraging behavioural change, where a generation of Australian children act responsibly online—just as they would offline.

They provide <u>online safety education</u> for Australian children and young people, a complaints service for young Australians who experience <u>serious cyberbullying</u>, and address illegal online content through the <u>Online Content Scheme</u>.

Their website has an enormous amount of information to support parents and caregivers to guide and learn about online safety. They offer a range of services, although I thought the iParent section on the website was very

informative. They also have an age appropriate guide based on the latest apps teenagers are using and some great step-by-step processes to follow regarding privacy on phones and devices.

It is well worth a look if you would like to learn more. I have included a couple of their fact sheets with some statistics regarding Aussie kids online, managing devices at home and strategies used at home to keep kids online safe. Let's keep our kids safe online.
