Principal's Report

Last week was a busy time for the Years 9 -12 debating teams. On Thursday the 19th May, Orange High School hosted a debating day for the Years 9 & 10 Premier's Debating Challenge. The Year 9 and 10 teams competed against Blayney High School. The Year 9 team were undefeated on the day, and as a result, have progressed through to the next stage of the competition. Year 11 and 12 teams completed their zone debates. The day started with the Year 12 team debating against Blayney via Video Conference. The debate was adjudicated in Sydney by Lloyd Cameron who is in charge of all of NSW Public School Debating. Fortunately, our team came away with the win. The Year 11 team had already won against The Henry Lawson High School earlier in the term and it was their turn to challenge the Year 12 team. Once again, the very experienced Year 12 girls came away with the win. With all debates completed for our zone, The Year 12 team has come through the rounds undefeated and will also progress to the next round of The Years 11 & 12 Premier's Debating Challenge.
