## Wheelers ePlatform

Orange High School library now has an ePlatform available to all Orange High Community.

The ePlatform can be accessed by following the link; <https://orangehighschool.wheelers.co/>

This link is also available on the Orange High School web page and through the student portal.

The range of eBooks has been chosen by the consortium schools involved, and cater for primary students through to year 12 advanced readers. The range includes, fiction, nonfiction and classics. The eBooks may be read on tablets, smartphones and computers.

There are hundreds of books available to staff, parents and students of Orange High School. Any school community member may register to use the ePlatform by registering online. Once it is verified that you are a member of the school community your application will be accepted and you will be notified by email.

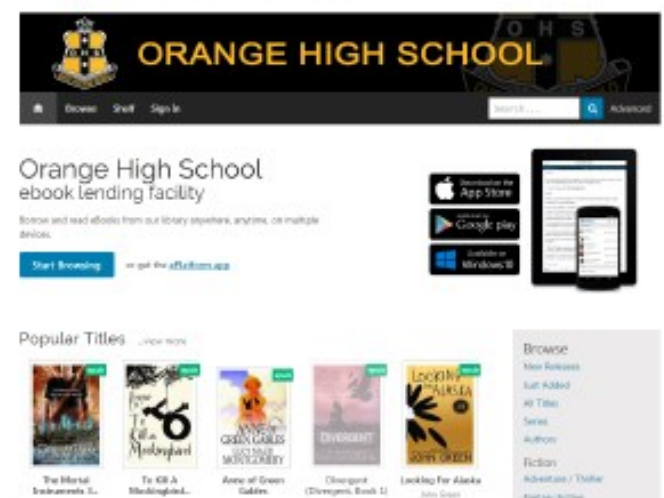
The eBooks are loaned for 2 weeks, however they can be returned early, re-borrowed or reserved. The eBooks are borrowed from the website and may be read in a web browser or in an app. The apps are available for Android, iOS and Windows. At the end of the 2 week loan the book drops from your device, however you are given prior warning.

Settings allow each individual reader to adjust the page layout and font size. The settings also allow for night reading and dyslexia settings.

The eBooks can be bookmarked, notes can be added, definitions found and word search inside the text is available.

Borrowing our eBooks is as easy as:

1. Search for and download the ePlatform app from your app store or follow our link <https://orangehighschool.wheelers.co/>
2. Find Orange High School Library and log in using your library ID
3. Browse and borrow an eBook to read on your device.
