One of the stories on high rotation during this week's nationwide news cycle was the annual national NAPLAN results release. At this stage, results have not been released to schools but we look forward to reviewing and learning from our students results in the coming weeks. One of the changes, that perhaps has not received the same level of publicity, is the requirement for an equivalent Band 8 NAPLAN result in reading, writing and numeracy in order for students to qualify for a HSC from 2020 onwards. This change will first affect students currently in Year 8. It is important that parents and students don't panic should their results not tick that box in Year 7 this year or in coming years, as there will be support measures and online assessments developed at a state level to enable the standard to be met. Further, as a school, we are beginning to investigate a range of possible strategies that can be implemented at a local school level to support students achieve the set standard.

Many thanks also to our education partners at Charles Sturt University who have sponsored us with \$1000 of new science equipment. Some of this will be used in our upcoming Science Show. Our Science Team will celebrate and share with our partner primary schools, and the general public, the importance of Science Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) to our future community health, wellbeing and living standards.

During the Term 2 holiday break Orange High School had two Hearing Loops installed to assist students (and members of the public) who have a hearing impairment. The Hearing Loops were installed in the Gym and the Performing Arts Centre. The Hearing Loop in the Music Centre was also turned on.

The installation of this system enables students with a hearing impairment more equitable access to sound via a wire 'Loop' that circles the room and is connected to a sound system. The loop transmits the sound electromagnetically. The electromagnetic signal is then picked up by the telecoil (wireless antenna) in the hearing aid or cochlear implant. Students are able to use a hearing loop by turning on the T-switch on their hearing aid or cochlear implant activating the telecoil.


