OHS Year 8 students attended a presentation in Martin Place, Sydney on Tuesday 9 August, which included the Yu Ni On Drumming group, a graceful Japanese Fan Dance, martial arts and weapons routines. We also heard from the Deputy Commissioner of Fire and Rescue, about how 75 fire and rescue men and women went to the Fukushima area to assist with international search and rescue after the magnitude 9.0 Tohoku Earthquake and Tsunami of 11 March 2011. The Japan Club of Sydney hosted a group of young students from the city of Minamisoma and these student's shared a variety of dances and performances for our enjoyment. Paul from JCS told the audience that these, and many other students, have not been able to return to their homes. Many of them are from rural and farming lifestyles, and are now forced to live in small urban flats. We were lucky and were able to have photos taken with the visitors.

We then went on to enjoy a sushi train lunch, a first for quite a few students, and visit a Japanese shop before returning home.
