To assist parents in the purchase of an appropriate device, we have some examples below, as well as some essential specifications and helpful hints to use when shopping. Every student at Orange High School will receive a full copy of Microsoft Office365. There is no need to purchase additional software with the device such as an antivirus program. We would advise against an Apple device, as not all the features of Office365 are available on Apple products.

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- Battery life needs to last the school day (6 hours). •
- Storage Minimum 32GB but 64GB or more is highly recommended (GB = Gigabytes).
- Memory (RAM) 4GB or more is highly recommended.
- Screen size minimum 10 inches.

- SSD Try shopping for a device with an SSD (Solid State Drive). These are much faster than older Hard Disk Drives (HDD) and have no moving parts, making them resistant to shock and movement.
- Touchscreen Students extensively use the program OneNote in the classroom, this benefits greatly from a touch screen as students can draw, and hand write notes right on their devices.
