Technology Inservice

Orange High hosted a digital technology workshop run by the Australian Computing Academy on Monday and Tuesday. Primary and secondary teachers from public and private schools attended the workshops to gain resources and an insight into what is needed to implement the new technology curriculum, soon to be taught in all school across Australia.

The workshops included case studies showcasing existing practice, school-wide scope & sequence, incorporating Australian Curriculum Academy resources and hands on experiences with free, classroom-ready resources that target the Digital Technologies curriculum. The introduction to various programming tools were also available, including visual and text-based programming, and object-oriented approaches. The workshops also explored 'Blockly' and 'Python' programming, covering coding aspects of Years 5-6 and 7-8 curriculum, focusing on defining and decomposing real-world problems, designing algoriothms and implementing programs. Feedback from the two days was extremely positive.

In addition to these 2 days the presenters from the Australian Computing Academy are running a student workshop at Orange High for students enrolled in our iSTEM program. This hour long workshop will give them hands on experience and introduce them to different types of programming to create algorithms to run robots and Apps.











Western Region Academy of Sport (WRAS) 2018 Netball Squad Trials

The WRAS 2018 netball program is part of the Netball NSW Athlete Pathway. The program will run from November 2017 to August 2018.

The selection process for the 2018 squad is:

Phase 1 selection trials – open to netballers born in 2002, 2003 and 2004 living or attending school in the WRAS catchment area. The WRAS catchment includes the following council areas: Bathurst Regional, Bland, Blayney, Cabonne, Cowra, Dubbo Regional (including Wellington), Forbes, Gilgandra, Hilltops (including Young), Lachlan, Lithgow, Mid-Western Regional, Narromine, Oberon, Orange, Parkes and Weddin.

Phase 2 selection trial – by invitation only.

PHASE 1 TRIAL Sunday 27 August 2017 – Orange (Kinross Wolaroi School)

OR

Sunday 3 September 2017 – Dubbo (Dubbo Christian School)

The number of places at each location will be limited.

Netballers cannot attend both days. WRAS will attempt to allocate places on 1st choice of date/location. However, this may not be possible for all. Places will be allocated in the order that nominations are received.

To be invited to Phase 2 (final selection trial for WRAS 2018 squad) netballers must attend one of the Phase 1 trials, be an age eligible WRAS 2017 squad athlete or be identified by Netball NSW.

A list of athletes invited to Phase 2 will be published on the <u>WRAS website</u> by Thursday 7 September 2017. All netballers who attend Phase 1 trials will receive email notification after the list is published.
