#### **Remembrance Day**

On the 11<sup>th</sup> November, I was privileged to attend the 100<sup>th</sup> commemoration of the Armistice. It was a truly humbling experience to see the recreation of life 100 years ago. More so, were the manner in which our school captains, Lucy Johnston and Cain Selwood addressed the audience and the beautiful voice of Bella Sattler accompanied by one of our school bands. Our students were absolutely brilliant in their conduct and I have received many positive comments about how amazing our students and school are. Congratulations to all involved.

#### **Chris Mickle Retirement**

On Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> November, I attended the official retirement function of Mrs Chris Mickle. Mrs Mickle was a true advocate and ambassador of Orange High School over many years and transformed the Music program within our school. The tributes and stories which were shared on the evening were testament to the person Chris is and how she shaped the lives of so many thousands of students and staff over her 41 year career. Thankyou again to our stage band and to Mrs Prusiak for your music on the evening. Absolutely brilliant.

#### **Talent Development Program (TDP)**

Over the past month we have held a range of parent focus groups and parent information sessions on our redesigned Talent Development Program. There will be many more opportunities for students to join the talent development program with an additional 30 places available in the academic arm of the program for Year 7 students in 2019. Details will be provided to families shortly regarding applying for one of these positions.

There will be a very different approach to our teaching in 2019. A focus on inquiry based learning concepts coupled with a strong focus on explicit instruction will provide our students with the skills they will need to be successful post school.

Changes to assessment practice, acceleration, high academic rigor and teaching and learning spaces will become evident across the Talent Development Program over the coming months. An addition to the TDP in 2020 will look to include a performing arts stream along with a pre-elite sporting stream to our school along with a continued increase to the number of students accessing our academic arm of the program.

We have built into our Year 7 program, a resilience and emotional wellbeing program along with a Drama program to give our students an opportunity to interact with their peers closely. All students will benefit from this. Our TDP students will benefit from the same program of resilience and wellbeing in Years 8-10.

This is a very exciting time for Orange High School and we are excited about continuing to provide educational excellence for many years to come. I will continue to provide updates as they arise.

#### School Spectacular 2019

As we send this newsletter to you this week, 31 students and three staff have been in Sydney preparing for the 2019 Schools Spectacular. I cannot wait to see our students on Friday evening as they perform as featured artists, featured dancers, ensemble dancers and the combined choir. Congratulations to all of our students.

#### **Proposed Uniform Changes**

In September 2019 we will be releasing two changes to our school uniform. The first being a new and updated sports shirt. Our students have told us that our sports shirt needs to be updated and the P&C have been working on a new design for a significant period of time. This shirt will be available from the beginning of term 4 2019.

We will also be releasing a new skort for students who wish to transition from the current skirt that most of our young ladies wear everyday. The skort is a combination of shorts and skirt. We will provide an update on this proposed release to the new skort early in term 1 after we survey our students later this term. These skorts will be available from the beginning of term 4 2019.

#### **Subject Contributions**

May I take this opportunity to remind each family of the requirement to finalise their 2018 (and in some cases prior to 2018) subject contributions. As a NSW Government School, we do not charge families thousands and thousands of dollars in annual fees however, the subject contributions which are charged are to cover some of the cost of consumables and resources related to subjects which your children may be studying or have elected to study. There is also a voluntary school contribution which is tax deductible should families wish to support the school in this capacity. If students have not paid their required subject contributions, from the beginning of 2019, they will not be eligible to represent the school in any extra curricula activity nor attend any non compulsory school functions. ## Remembrance Day 2018




This year marked the 100th Anniversary of the Armistice which ended the First World War and was commemorated at Robertson Park on Sunday 11th November 2018.




