### All Schools Triathlon Teams event

During the school holidays we had 13 students travel down to the Penrith Regatta Centre to compete at the Australian Schools Triathlon Championships. The students competed in four different events: National Championship Triathlon, Open Schools Aquathon, Open Schools Relay and Championship Mixed Relay.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TRIATHLON: Kaitlyn Hinrichsen raced the Junior Age Triathlon representing NSW in her 2nd ever triathlon! She showed her strength in the swim coming out of the water in 3rd place, then after working hard in a head wind for the ride, she ran home finishing 11th in Australia.
