Western CHS Soccer ~ Grand final win for OHS

Open Boys Game vs Dubbo

Report: An uncharacteristically warm winter's day at Dubbo's Hans Claven Oval was to be the setting of our Grand Final match for the Western CHS Soccer Conference. Dubbo, having breezed through the North Western bracket of the competition, are a dominant force in the region for soccer and posed quite a challenge. The boys were confident but wary of the matchup ahead, mainly due to their 2-1 defeat last week in the Malynley shield. That game they were not at their best and they were eager to do all they could to forget it.

This game started very frantically with both sides having genuine chances of going in front. Our back line faced great stress early dealing with the quickest teenager I have ever seen on a soccer field. Lloyd, Hugh, Tyler and Myles put in a lot of effort and worked tooth and nail to keep us in the game. A few early chances from Jady, Mitch, Cameron and Rowan kept Dubbo on their toes but we were still goalless. Going into the break Dubbo held a slight advantage due to some amazing wing work that tested Jordan Bruce, the wonder goalie, but he held strong and stopped everything that came his way.

The second half saw some tactical genius from the brilliant Coach Bell. A restructuring of our thin backline, due to injuries from Puxty and Clancy, was needed to replenish weary legs. Tom Radnedge, our inform Centre Midfielder, moved to the back line and played the game of his season withstanding consistent pressure on the left edge and being a constant threat. Mitch, Aaron and Cameron secured the midfield early in the half and eventually we were on the front foot. Some great over the top movement from Jordy Bruce to our front three constantly put pressure on their backline and eventually led to our first goal. A great run from Rowan down the left edge with a chip over their keeper with 10 minutes till the end of the game gave us respite for the intense pressure the game had created. All of us on the bench willed the ball past the line and celebrated a bit too hard.

The game was not done yet. In an attempt to slow the game down Captain Mitch instructed me to make as many subs as possible. Oliver and Harry put in great stints off the bench jumping into multiple positions and ensuring tired legs from Dubbo could not rest. Four minutes after our first goal we snatched another one. This was through great play up the right edge by Karl Moes who unselfishly passed it in the centre to a perfectly placed Charlie. As cool as ever he slotted it and ensured the game was ours.

It was an amazing performance by our team. The heat got to a few of the boys and forced everyone to work much harder than normal. They rose to the occasion and I couldn't be prouder as a coach, mentor and friend of these amazing lads.

Special mention goes to Jordan Bruce who was the man of the match today and single-handedly kept us in the game at times when we were flat. He was not just a goal keeper, he was a sweeper and a source of inspiration. Throughout the comp he has only conceded one goal which is an amazing feat that deserves recognition.

Next up we face the champion of the Western Sydney Region in the final 12 of the competition.

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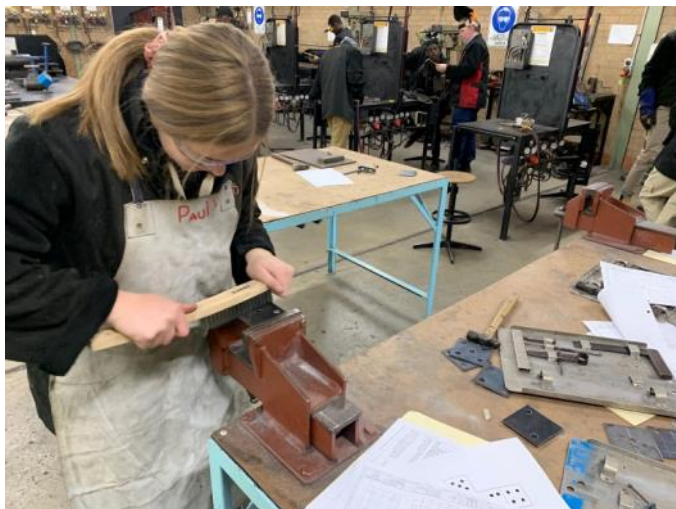
Year 9 Child Studies

Careers

This semester has been a very busy one for the Career Connection Office.

So far this year, Orange High School has either hosted or participated in twenty Careers-related excursions or events. Given that there has only been nineteen school weeks this year, this illustrates the diverse extra-curricula opportunities students have access to which are all designed to help students research their post-school options.

One opportunity that I wish to highlight is the **YES Program**. This program is joint funded by TAFE NSW and the DoE Workplace Engagement Project. Unfortunately, only 12 Year 10 students were able to participate (I wish 200 could!) during Term 3. The easiest way of explaining this program is it is the ultimate work experience where students can sample 9 industries/courses on offer at our local TAFE NSW campuses.

The **Facts About Careers & Tertiary Study (FACTS) Day** was another success story (not just because I organised it) for the Central West Careers Advisers Association. There were sixty exhibitors from local industry, tertiary institutions and training providers in attendance to provide careers information and guidance to the nearly 900 Year 12 students from across the Central West in attendance. Our students were able to spend time in the Careers Market and also listen to a guest speaker from either Training Services NSW or the Universities Admission Centre (UAC). From all reports, it was a great day that will aim to be even bigger and better next year!

Year 10 students have fortnightly Careers Lessons and a big part of the teaching scope and sequence is researching potential careers pathways. For the benefit of the whole school community I have included in this newsletter a **Helpful Links for Students** which includes some of the login and password details for careers websites that Orange High School has subscriptions for student use. Some amazing information and activities students can engage with to help them navigate the important decisions they will need to make in regards to their future career pathways.

Also included is our **Save The Dates Term 3** which is pretty full already, especially each Wednesday where our partnership with Charles Sturt University will see academic staff engage with most of our Year 7 to Year 10 students through the **Future Moves Program**.
