P&C Meeting


The first P&C meeting will be held on Wednesday 14th August commencing at 6.30pm in the school music centre. All parents are welcome and encouraged to attend.






HSC Music Performance Night


Congratulations to James Sheahan for retaining the shield and we look forward to 2020 when we hope to reclaim it!

Congratulations to these students for being recognised for their talent and dedication to Visual Arts.








National Art School Scholarship

Bathurst Jobs Expo




On Tuesday 30th July, fifty-seven Year 10 students participated in the Bathurst Jobs Expo.


