

NSW All Schools Triathlon




Sustainability Grant

Here are some pictures of activities that have been taking place.


































Inquisitive Minds

With Orange's water supply now below 30% capacity, the city has moved to Level 5 water restrictions. What does this mean?

RESIDENTIAL GARDENS

- No sprinklers, microsprays, or soaker hoses
- Drip systems, buckets and watering cans on Sundays only 6pm-7pm
- One hand-held hose with a trigger-nozzle for up to half an hour during that period.

BATHS AND SHOWERS

- Suggested limit of 3 minute shower.
- One shallow bath per day.

WASHING MACHINES

· Full loads only.

EVAPORATIVE COOLERS

 Only to be used 7am to midnight daily.

NO

- Topping up water features
- · New turf
- · Pop-up children's pools.
- · Washing cars at home.
- Watering lawns.
- Topping up or filling swimming pools.
- Washing hard surfaces eg buildings and paving.
