

Intensive Learning Support Program

The 2021 COVID intensive learning support program will provide small group tuition for students who need it most across NSW primary, secondary and specialist schools.

Through the COVID intensive learning support program, schools have been provided with funding to employ additional educators who will deliver small group tuition for students.

The program will start during Term 1, 2021 and run throughout the school year. Initially, small groups of students in Year 8 and 9 will be provided with intensive literacy and numeracy tuition. After school tutoring will also be available for students in Years 11 and 12 across a range of specific subject areas.

School Fees


There are two types of fees in 2021. The VOLUNTARY school contribution assists our school to purchase resources to support our students. This is a voluntary fee but would be highly appreciated. The second component to our fees are the subject contributions. These are the fees associated with practical subjects. The fees are already heavily subsidised by the school however, contribution from parents is required to allow students to participate in the practical component of these subjects. Invoices will be sent to all families in Term 1 and will be followed up with emails throughout the year. Please ensure you pay for these fees promptly. Payments can be made via the school website, over the phone or in person using cash or credit/debit card. Students with outstanding fees may be ineligible to participate in any non-compulsory school based activities. If you need assistance with any aspect of the mandatory fees, please contact our Head Teachers of Wellbeing - Mrs Kylie Winslade (Years 7/9/11) or Miss Mon Peasley (Years 8/10/12).

Uniform

As you are aware, OHS is a uniform wearing school. A full list of our uniform requirements is located on our website. I ask for your full support in ensuring your children wear the correct school uniform each and every day including the wearing of black school shoes. Sports uniform is not to be worn to school. 

ATTENDANCE NEWS

Remember 2021 we have a very high expectation in regards to attendance.

The expectations are:

- 1. Be at school on time 9am the music starts, students head straight to class, be at the door by 9:04am.
- 2. Attend all lessons promptly.
- 3. As soon as the music starts for the end of recess and lunch, head straight to class, don't fill up water bottles or head to the bathroom (tasks like these, need to be completed during breaks get organised, this will help prepare you for the future)
- 4. If late to school, head to the **middle office** to get signed in and receive a late note, then head straight to class.
- 5. If a teacher takes a student out of class for any reason, they will fix up their attendance.
- 6. Finally, if a student is absent for a whole day, a guardian can write a note and the student will place it outside the middle office in the letterbox OR they can ring the office and let the school know OR guardians can enter an absence through the Parent Portal.

For sick leave please ensure students get a medical certificate and submit it to the school support their leave.




